**P2 PREMIUM PROCESSING UNIT- EXPEDITED PROCESSING**

**A P2 Work Permit for Non-Immigrant can be processed and approved (if eligible) by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service within \*15 calendar days of receipt of the application by the USCIS.**

**PLEASE READ ON!**

*On December 21, 2000, the President of the United States of America signed the District of Columbia Appropriations Act, 2001, Public Law 106-553, 114 Stat. 2762 (2000). The legislation added a new section 286(u) to the Immigration and Nationality Act (Act) that authorizes the Attorney General to charge a \$1,000 "premium processing" fee which is in addition to the regular filing fee that must be paid when filing certain petitions and applications. This 'Act' requires USCIS receiving applications under the Premium Processing category, to process these applications and provide a response to the applicant within \*15 calendar days of it's receipt.*

For example: if the applicant remits the Premium Processing Fee upon acceptance, U.S.C.I.S. will issue a Receipt or Approval Notice, Notice of Intent to Deny, Request for Evidence, or a Notice of an Investigation for Fraud or Misrepresentation - within 15 calendar days. **Premium Processing Service begins on the day the Service physically receives a petition and is completed on the day the Service issues a 'Notice' or 'Request'.** If the Service fails to issue such notice or request within \*15 calendar days, the Service will refund the fee automatically and in this instance U.S.C.I.S. will still *expeditiously* process the case. In the event U.S.C.I.S. determines that the application or petition is not eligible for Premium Processing Service, the fee will be refunded and U.S.C.I.S. will continue to process the case within the normal time period.

**SHOULD YOU WISH TO UTILIZE THIS SERVICE** please include a U.S.D. money order payable to **U.S.C.I.S. (UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP AND IMMIGRATION SERVICE)** in the amount of \$1,000.00. Include this money order with your application. The \$1,000.00 Premium Processing fee is **in addition** to the petition fee of **\$320.00**. This fee is a 'per petition' fee. If you are applying for technical crew or support staff (any non-musician) an additional \$1,000.00USD is required.

*Please note, Canada Post and Canadian Credit Union Money Orders are NOT accepted by U.S.C.I.S.*

Should you decide **NOT** to proceed with Premium Processing regular time frames apply. Regular processing time frames fluctuate between 95 - 125 days.

You can request Premium Processing when a file is already in process. In such cases, please contact AFM Canada for further instruction/information **at least** 30 days prior to your intended date of entry.

**\*PLEASE NOTE\***: USCIS begins 'counting' the 15 days from the day **THEY** receive the petition. AFM Canada will endeavor to process all premium processing files on the same day they are received. However, AFM policy dictates a 72 hour turn around period, so please take this into consideration before applying. In addition, AFM Canada sends all files for processing to the California Service Center via overnight courier. Be advised that it may take 2 – 5 days for USCIS to physically receipt your application after it is sent by AFM.
